I've learned that no one but me should decide how I feel; let alone those who (holding me in low esteem) insult , slander or call my entire self into question.

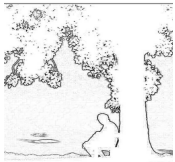
I've learned that when I want to please everybody, I end up pleasing no one, including myself.
